Planting the seedlings

STEP 1



Fill a container with water (at room temperature).

STEP 2



Soak the substrate granules in the container of water for 5 minutes.

STEP 3



Remove the substrate, let it drain well and fill the pots with it, mixing it lightly with the sand.

STEP 4



Open the seed packets and sow them on the surface. Cover them with a thin layer of substrate (less than a millimeter).

STEP 5



Take the greenhouse and close it, leaving the ventilation valve closed. Ventilate for an hour, once a day.

STEP 6



Place the pots in a well-lit location, but away from direct sunlight, at a temperature above 20°C.

RECOMMENDATION:

The substrate should drain as well as possible. Before placing it in the pots, it should be only slightly moist.

4 mistakes to avoid

1. Excess water

This is probably the biggest risk. A succulent seed needs water to germinate, but the young root is very sensitive to excessive moisture.



2. Bury the seeds deeply.

These small seedlings should be planted almost on the surface.



3. Absence of light after germination

A seedling may germinate properly, but it will become too leggy and fragile if it doesn't get enough light.



4. After germination, keep the mini-greenhouse closed.

High humidity is beneficial before germination, but becomes significantly less important after seedlings emerge.

GUIDE

Succulents are plants that store water in their leaves, stems, or roots, allowing them to survive periods of drought. They generally thrive best in bright locations and, after a period of acclimation, can tolerate several hours of direct sunlight. Their growth can be slow, but in the right conditions, they are usually easy to care for.



The main problem to avoid is overwatering. Ideally, use a well-draining substrate and let it dry out between waterings. During the growing season, water abundantly and allow the soil to drain completely; in winter, significantly reduce or even completely suspend watering, depending on the plant species and temperature.



For healthy growth, it's important to adapt care to specific environmental conditions. Many plants prefer warmth and light, but a plant accustomed to shade should be gradually acclimated to sunlight to avoid sunburn. A pot with drainage holes, a well-draining substrate, and moderate watering are generally an excellent starting point.

Aloe vera



Aloe vera is a succulent plant native to hot, arid regions, prized for its fleshy leaves that store water and produce a gel inside. It's easy to grow and thrives in sunny, warm locations with well-drained soil. It tolerates drought better than waterlogged soil.

Tip: Always let the substrate dry completely between waterings to prevent root rot.

Grocery Store Carpenter

Carpobrotus edulis, also known as witch's claw, is a creeping succulent native to South Africa. It features fleshy, triangular leaves and large, brightly colored flowers. It is highly drought-tolerant and thrives in full sun, nutrient-poor soil, and good drainage.

Tip: Water lightly but thoroughly and let the substrate dry completely before watering again.



Mix of succulent plants



A succulent mix allows you to combine different shapes, colors, and textures in a single composition. They generally prefer light, well-drained soil, moderate watering, and a drier dormancy period during the winter.

Tip: Always use a pot with drainage holes and let the substrate dry completely between waterings.
